Quality and the OSBI Criminalistic Services Division

This month's speaker will be Erin Henry, Criminalist Administrator in charge of Quality Control at the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation (OSBI). Since its creation in 1953, the OSBI Criminalistic Services Division has been responsible for providing forensic laboratory services to Oklahoma law enforcement. This Division operates from the Central Laboratory in Oklahoma City and from four regional laboratories in Tahlequah, Enid, Lawton and McAlester. The Criminalistic Services Division provides forensic analysis in the following areas: serology; trace evidence; marijuana/drugs; toxicology; latent prints; DNA; firearms and toolmarks and questioned documents.

Erin's presentation will include the structure of the OSBI, the services the laboratory division provides, and how certain organizations impact their QA program.

She will cover is the ASCLD/LAB (American Society of Crime Laboratory Directors/Laboratory Accreditation Board). They offer ASCLD/LAB Legacy accreditation and an ASCLD/LAB International accreditation. The International program adopts standards from ISO (International Standards Organization). Also included will be the additional requirements set forth for DNA analysis that are covered in the Quality Assurance Standards for Forensic DNA Testing Laboratories. These are standards issued by the FBI.

Erin Henry extensive background started when she began working with OSBI August of 1997 as an intern in Toxicology and DNA units. She graduated from University of Oklahoma with a Bachelor's degree in Microbiology and was hired as a Criminalist with the Forensic Biology Unit in OKC lab April 1999. In 2001 she Assumed responsibilities of CODIS Administrator. She became the Criminalist Supervisor for CODIS Unit upon its creation September 2003. Her current title is the Criminalist Administrator in charge of Quality Control.

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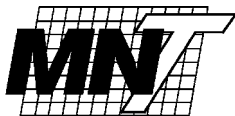
